DOUBLETREE HOTEL BY HITLON – CHATTANOOGA/DOWNTOWN AWARDED THE 2011 GOVERNOR’S ENVIROMENTAL STEWARDSHIP AWARD

CHATTANOOGA, July 5, 2011 – Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam has awarded The DoubleTree Hotel by Hilton - Chattanooga Downtown the 2011 Governor's Environmental Stewardship Award for Pollution Prevention. The award recognizes the many green initiatives that The DoubleTree Hotel has incorporated into the hotel and the surrounding community.

A few of the hotels green features include (but are not limited to): the installation of low-flow toilets and shower heads, energy efficient light bulbs, double-paned and insulated windows, and the installation of bathroom light fixtures controlled by motion sensors.
